Writing thank you letters


Children are expected to write thank you notes when they receive a special gift. Teaching children how to write this type of text can be a real challenge.

Guided questions are considered to be a good way to ease children, and others new to English language, the way written sentences should look.

For example:

Guided Questions	
Were you very happy to see us?	I was very happy to see you.
Were you very surprised?	I was very surprised
Was it a great birthday surprise?	It was a great birthday surprise.
Do you want to thank us, your grandparents?	I want to thank you, my grandparents.

Guided Questions	
Are you excited to see us in September?	I am excited to see you in September.
Are you looking forward to visiting the pack near our house and seeing our cat?	I am looking forward to visiting the park near your house and seeing your cat.
Are you looking forward to showing us a song you learned at school?	I am also looking forward to showing you a song I learned in school.
Are you happy you will see us soon?	I am happy I will see you soon.
